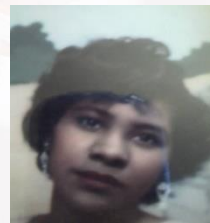

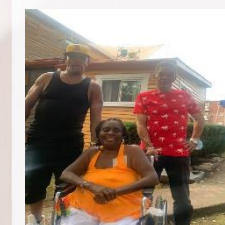
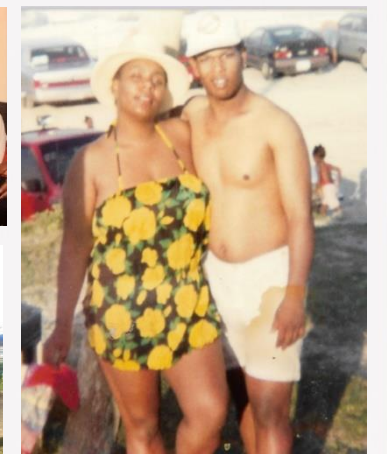
Over the last year, she enjoyed the simple things like sitting outside in the sun and being in the presents of her family. She put up a good fight and always kept her faith.
