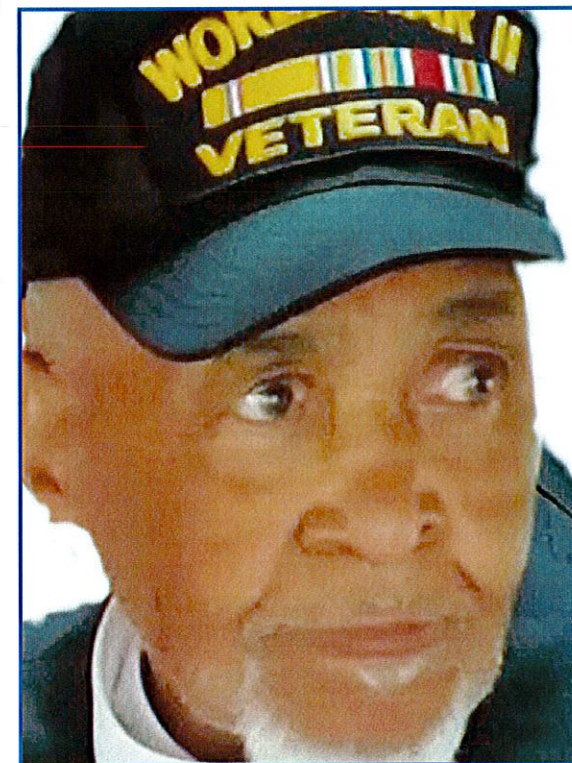

Arthur B. Jones was born January 31, 1924 in Tchula, Mississippi to John Albert Jones, Sr. and Fannie Mae Jones. He was the third of ten children.

In 1942 he was drafted in the U.S. Army. After ten months of training, in preparation for World War II, he spent a year in England where he helped build equipment. After leaving England he spent time in France and by June 6, 1944, D-Day he fought at Normandy Beach. When the soldiers reached Normandy their ship was hit by enemy fire. Arthur was the last soldier to leave the ship after all the other soldiers, who had not drowned had gotten off. Upon reaching the land enemy fire hit near the spot where Arthur had stepped and he was knocked out and left for dead. When he came to himself he was eventually reunited with his company. There were 181 soldiers in his company when they reached Normandy, and after battle he was one of 63. Arthur received an Honorable Discharge from the U.S. Army, December 11, 1945. He was a patriotic and valiant soldier!

On February 26, 1946 Arthur married Ella B. Dotson, and then the newlyweds moved to Boston, Massachusetts. Arthur and Ella lived happily married for 68 years until the Lord took her home to her reward. They lovingly reared one daughter, Arnita.

He is preceded in death by his mother, Fannie Mae Jones; his father, Superintendent John Albert Jones, Sr.; his six brothers, Lawrence, Nathaniel, John, Jr., Hervin, James Lloyd, and Samuel; two sisters, Rosia and Lettie; and a great granddaughter, Morgan Renee Ogunyemi.

He leaves to cherish his memories and continue his legacy, his sister, Mary Ella Burse-Wright; three sisters-in-law, Mary L., Sandra, and Mary; his daughter, Arnita; six grandchildren, Alyssia (Eugene) Daniel, Latoya Reed, Clement (Maria Jose) Ogunyemi, Joshua (Michelle) Ogunyemi, Olaolu (Brea) Ogunyemi, and Daniel (Ki) Ogunyemi; fifteen great grandchildren; a host of nieces, nephews; great nieces and nephews, great-great nieces and nephews, and one great-great-great nephew.
