

Walter Alfred Stevenson of Roxbury, Massachusetts, passed away suddenly on April 4, 2021. He was born January 2, 1959 in Cleveland, Ohio. He was the first of three children born to the late Vellerews (Wade) and the late Reverend Walter A. Stevenson.

In 1969, Reverend Stevenson was employed as an Executive Chef and was required to travel. The family left Cleveland, Ohio and relocated to Dallas, Texas; and later moved the family to Hartford,

Connecticut. In 1972, the family settled in Boston, Massachusetts.

Walter graduated Boston High School in 1979 and continued his education at Newbury Junior College where he earned a certificate in Food Service and Hospitality Management. Walter was employed as a first or second cook at Boston University Food Service Department, Brigham and Women's Hospital, and Lemuel Shattuck Hospital where he retired in 2006.

Walter lived at the 125 Amory Street Apartments where he served as the Vice President of the Residents' Task Force. He resided there with his life companion and caretaker, Jennifer E. Lomba. They were together for twenty-eight years.
