Born to Della Mae Hall and Whiley Hickerson in Memphis Tennessee. Beverly was the baby girl of 9.

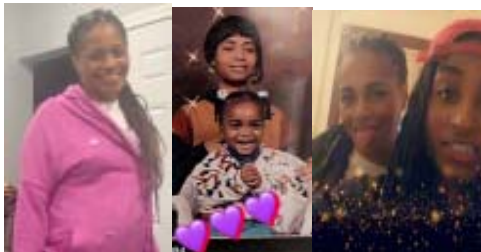
