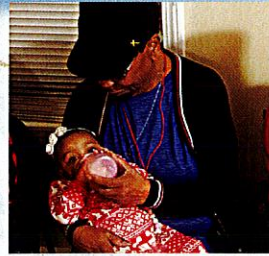
## A Time To Labor...
